Early Bird (Jan 10 – Feb 29) General registration is \$150 / \$160 with pizza party.

Students registration is \$50 / \$60 if include pizza party. **After Feb 29, 5:00 pm, registration is \$200.**

**Transportation:** Round trip travel to DC and transport by car, cab, train, subway or bus while in DC. Those staying at CEDC will have a 15 minute walk to the subway. Shared cabs when needed are relatively cheap.

**Meals:** Training day – will cover catered continental breakfast, lunch and beverages. Monday night is pizza, salad, fun and cheap drinks. Tuesday evening includes light reception fare. There are usually snacks and bagels at the ANA office. Food is relatively inexpensive in the Senate and House office buildings and there are a variety of restaurants nearby.
